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Arden Point Trail, Tarrytown; Garrison, NY

Trip: New York (Grand Central Terminal) to Tarrytown to Garrison; then to Tarrytown and New York City

- Total train time: 2 hours, 34 minutes (1 hour 17 minutes each way)
 - Weekend trains to Tarrytown leave three times every hour.
 - Round-trip fares (off-peak if you're traveling on the weekend, or mid-day during the week) are \$20.50.
 - If you're traveling on the weekend, make sure you're purchasing off-peak tickets.
 - Dogs are allowed on Metro-North trains east of the Hudson, if they're well-behaved. Tarrytown is especially dog-friendly.

Tarrytown Recommended:

- Westchester Riverwalk park on the waterfront, between the train station and the river.
- The Lighthouse Ice Cream Company: ice cream/coffee shop just a few yards from the train station on the river side.
- RiverMarket Bar and Kitchen: upscale full-service restaurant serving lunch, dinner and weekend brunch. Next to the Lighthouse.
- Muddy Water Café serves coffee, pastries, other beverages. Main Street.
- Coffee Labs roasters is further up the hill in Tarrytown, also along Main Street.
- Little B's, also on Main Street.
- Fast-casual recommendation: Taco Project, Lubins and Links (gourmet hotdogs)
- Washington Irving Boat Club pier, for bad fried food and drinks, and exceptional outdoor, riverside views of the sunset and bridge. Walk south from the train station, on the river side of the tracks, to the very end of the road/parking areas.

Garrison Recommended:

- Garrison Café (has wifi and bathrooms) serves hot/cold food, ice cream, coffee, desserts and pastries, salads and gourmet pizza. It's .9 miles from the train station. Walk uphill on Lower Station Road to Route 9D, then turn left. It's on the left-hand side of the road.
